So for many, being an American is synonymous with being a follower of Jesus.

This however is a form of idolatry. We have created the Gospel in our image, we have put God and Jesus into a box we can control and we have distorted the mandates of Jesus and the prophets to support our particular ideologies. This has had devastating consequences.

We are living through perilous and polarizing times as a country and Christianity has been the rallying cry of many. It is time for us to reclaim Jesus if we are ever going to live out the Good News faithfully.

To this end Sojourners whose catch phrase, “Building a Movement to Transform the World,” summarizes their mission, has offered a statement for American Christians to embrace and educational resources to reclaim Jesus.

This past year our Bible Study group studied Brian McLaren’s book, The Great Spiritual Migration. In it he argued that for Christianity to be relevant it needed to migrate from a system of beliefs of a way of life, the way of Jesus, the way of Love.

Similarly, those who are joining the, Reclaiming Jesus Movement are arguing that it is time for us to be followers of Jesus before anything else--nationality, political party, race, ethnicity, gender, geography. Rather, our identity in Christ precedes every other identity.

This fall, I will begin a sermon series based on the Reclaiming Jesus Movement. I will be using the study resources found on their website (www.ReclaimingJesus.org). Following worship, there will be an opportunity to discuss the themes covered in the sermons. My hope is that those present at church will stay for the conversation.

The questions to be explored in the series include: Who is Jesus Christ for us today? What does our loyalty to Christ, as disciples, require at this moment in our history? The authors of the statement have declared: “We believe it is time to renew our theology of public discipleship and witness. Applying what “Jesus is Lord” means today is the message we commend as elders to our churches.”

As our program year begins, may we remember our Baptismal vows and commit to nurturing our relationship with God, ourselves and our neighbors in the name of our Lord Jesus the Christ who announced the reign of God is at hand.

There will be a joint mission project/ trip and hopefully a visit to another place of worship

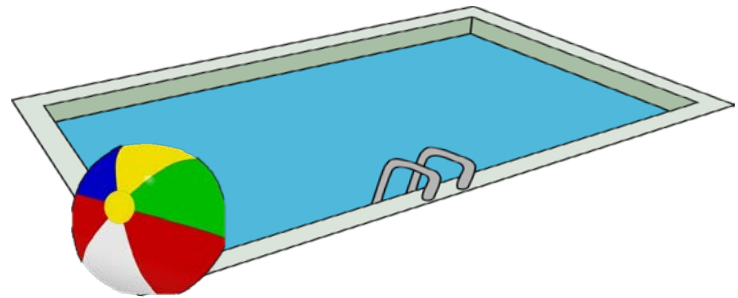
Deacons' Corner
