Our imagination is the single most important asset we possess. Imagination is the source of all innovation, invention, play. Great discoveries have come about and continue to come about because someone imagined it.

The ideas that spring from our imagination itself are a mystery. The inspiration behind them offered as a gift from the Source of all. I like to call that Source the Holy Spirit.

This summer I read the book Big Magic by Elizabeth Gilbert the author of Eat, Pray, Love. She has a lot to say about “ideas.” She believes they have a will and consciousness of their own and spend eternity looking for ways to be manifest through collaboration with willing human partners. A bit quirky, I admit, it is entitled, Big Magic after all, but she makes a point I think is important for us to consider. When an idea presents itself to us we have a choice to make: to say yes to the idea or no. If we say no, nothing happens, the idea moves on to another. If we say yes, look out, our lives are about to change

Two thousand years ago, Jesus said yes to an idea and imagined a realm where everyone was valued and loved. He imagined a world where everyone had enough, and there was no hierarchy. In his ideal world based on the idea of radical love and hospitality, the least among us was of same importance as the highest and hate was overcome by fearlessness and violence overcome with love. Jesus spent his whole life asking: will you say yes to this idea? Will continue to imagine this Realm of God?

Two thousand years later he is still asking. As we once again begin our program year, I invite us to use our imaginations and say yes to ideas that come our way to further God’s realm here at Palisades. Can we cooperate with the Holy Spirit and open ourselves to the way God is asking us to collaborate with the Divine, so that through us, God’s imagination, God’s dream, becomes for us a reality? I hope so.


Sunday, September 8, 10:00 am. Bring your backpacks to worship and we will say a special blessing for the beginning of the school year!




Deacons' Corner
